The Anglican tradition of the Festival of Lessons and Carols dates back to 1880, when Edward White Benson (later to become Archbishop of Canterbury) designed the service for use on Christmas Eve in Cornwall, England. Lessons and Carols have become a tradition throughout much of the Anglican Communion. The readings follow the arch of salvation history with music for the season dispersed throughout.
